Dear Members, Volunteers and Staff,

Since stepping into the role of Acting Regional Director in February, I have been inspired by the dedication of our Members, Volunteers, and Staff across Greater Western Sydney. Thank you for the warm welcome. I look forward to continuing to support our shared Vincentian mission.

Since the last newsletter, we've seen strong community engagement across GWS. A key highlight is our youth engagement strategy, which saw over 1,000 expressions of interest at Western Sydney University's O-Week. Planning is also underway for the Mini Vinnies and Secondary School Gatherings in July, as well as preparations for this year's Winter Appeal, a vital campaign supporting those in need.

Advocacy remains a priority, with 50 members attending the Sydney Alliance Pre-Election Assembly alongside 900 community leaders. Locally, Conferences in Stanhope Gardens/Glenwood and Kellyville are hosting engagement events to grow our network.

In February, our Vinnies Support Centres in Blacktown, Harris Park, and Penrith assisted nearly 1,000 people, while new EAPA training will help more families manage energy costs. Vinnies Vans continue to provide critical support, assisting nearly 1,000 people last month, with a new Cumberland Council run now launched.

Thank you all for your dedication as members of the Society, it truly makes a difference.

Reflection & Renewal in Greater Western Sydney

Greater Western Sydney Central Council members gathered in the greenery of Mulgoa on a beautifully sunny Saturday in early February to start the year with time to explore the 'Why' of being a member of the Society, connect and share with other members, and learn more about available services and resources. Leon Ross, Nepean Regional Council President, desired to "have members come together to start the year off with spirituality, reflect on the year ahead, enjoy fellowship, and generate energy and synergies," which came to fruition.

Mass and morning tea started the day, followed by a rich presentation by Corinne Lindsell and Leo Tucker of the Mission & Spirituality Team. 50 plus members were in attendance and appreciated the time to be together and the variety of input and discussion. The afternoon topics included social justice, safeguarding, MAVS, Youth, recruitment, and engagement with the Society's Housing residents.

Larry Hegarty, Hills Regional Council President and member of Our Lady of the Way Baulkham Hills found the reflections thoughtful, powerful and came away with simple and practical ideas about service. He appreciated the exercise of improving one's service by asking the Lord, "What do you want from me? What is in my personal cup that I bring to my service?" and reflecting on, "How do I improve the life of those I serve to enable them to flourish, to renew their hope?"

"If I can implement these ideas into my service, it may improve the lives of those I serve and make me a better Vincentian," Larry said. Many were inspired by the presentations, with one Conference President who was intending to stand down from the position, newly rejuvenated to continue their Conference work. "That to me is the hand of God at work," Larry said. "I came away from the Retreat rejuvenated and refreshed for the year ahead." The afternoon presentations were an opportunity to meet face-to-face with some of the Society's people previously only known over phone. "They were a chance to bounce ideas off and seek direction from them on issues on my radar for our Hills Region."

Georg Eberl, Holy Family Emerton Conference President deeply appreciated the chance to reflect on spirituality, mission and values - who we are and why we do what we do. "Our spiritual reflection on the scriptures challenges us to use our talents to live the Gospel as Jesus did through a spirit of radical inclusiveness, accompaniment and restoration," Georg said. "Our mission is to share the love of God and restore the dignity of those we help so they can flourish because everybody matters every day."

"Let's keep that cup in our logo full of love as this is the most important thing we can bring."The afternoon presentations about our services and resources, alongside the networking across the Central Council and the Society, were also highly appreciated.

CHRISTMAS GIFT WRAPPING AT WESTFIELD PARRAMATTA

The Conferences of St Michael's and Our Lady of Lourdes in Baulkham Hills Parish in The Hills Region undertook two sessions of gift wrapping at Westfield Parramatta leading up to Christmas. Despite the challenging and time-consuming safety requirements and documentation needed to satisfy our hosts, we ended up with a wonderful mix of members assisted by their offspring, parishioners, Vinnies Youth members and overseas visitors. Supported by a few "Westfield Christmas Elves", everyone was keen to put into practice their bow-making and gift-wrapping talents.

The enthusiasm of the participants was evident, with volunteers returning for the second session in addition to their allocated first session. It was even difficult to get a few wrappers to take a rest and make way for the other enthusiasts to demonstrate their talents.

Through a gold coin donation for each gift, the two sessions raised more than \$1,100 in funds, which have already partly gone to providing uniforms for children starting a new school. Other positive outcomes included the camaraderie between volunteers and members, their interaction with shoppers, and the sharing of stories, giving the public a real and different face of Vinnies personnel and volunteers.

We also had young volunteers mixed with our more mature members, and again sharing stories and experiences. The challenge for us now is to build on the engagement with those youth and get them involved on a more permanent basis with our Conferences and Vinnies Youth activities. We look forward to the challenge, and to seeing how all our participants have kept up their bow-making and gift wrapping skills for the end of this year.

Schools in Parramatta Diocese alone raised an incredible \$103,755 worth of material donations, providing vital support to those in need during the festive season and beyond.

The Vinnies Christmas Appeal is a cornerstone of the Society's mission to assist individuals and families facing hardship. This year, schools not only contributed financially but also embraced a range of engagement opportunities to deepen their connection to the cause. Many students and staff supported Vinnies Vans, which provide meals and essentials to people experiencing homelessness, while others participated in initiatives like Busking for Vinnies and Youth Week activities. These events not only raised funds but also fostered a sense of empathy and community among young people.

The Mini Vinnies program also saw significant participation, with students gathering to learn about social justice and take practical steps to help others. These gatherings empowered young people to become advocates for change, embodying the values of compassion and service. High school students were also encouraged to take part in the *Vinnies Service Medallion*, a program that recognises their commitment to serving their communities through volunteering and social justice initiatives. The medallion is a wonderful way for students to make a tangible impact while developing leadership skills and a deeper understanding of the challenges faced by vulnerable populations.

C Stanhope Gardens Conference Sausage Sizzle Fundraiser

St Vincent DePaul Stanhope Gardens Conference NSW recent "Sausage Sizzle" fundraiser, held at Rouse Hill Bunnings on January 19th, was remarkably successful. We managed to cook and sell over **550 sausages to enthusiastic customers,** and the tempting aroma of nearly **20 kg of hand-cut onions sizzling on the BBQ** tempted many passersby to stop and enjoy a delicious sausage sandwich.

A significant aspect of the event's success was the generosity of the "Gift of Bread" charity, which donated 40 loaves of bread from their Community Workshop in Tempe. This charity plays a crucial role in providing surplus bread free of charge to charities that support vulnerable individuals experiencing food insecurity. **The event was driven by the hard work and dedication of over 15 enthusiastic volunteers, whose tireless efforts led us to achieve a net profit of \$1,769.99**, which was a significant accomplishment. Our devoted St Vincent de Paul conference members, along with their friends and family, played an essential role in making this event enjoyable and memorable. Volunteers worked in shifts to ensure that every customer was served promptly and efficiently. They handled everything from setting up the BBQ, preparing the sausages, cutting the onions, managing the cash register, and, of course, cleaning up after the event. Their teamwork and enthusiasm were truly commendable. The sausages were cooked to perfection, and the hand-cut onions added an extra layer of flavour that customers could not resist. We received numerous compliments on the taste and quality of our food, which undoubtedly contributed to our high sales numbers.

The event also highlighted the strong sense of community among the participants and supporters. Many parishioners, friends, and family members came out to show their support, creating a warm and welcoming atmosphere. This sense of togetherness is what makes events like these so special and successful.

St Vincent DePaul Stanhope Garden Conference is already planning to host another Bunnings Sausage Sizzle on March 30th. The funds raised from these events will enable the organisation to continue making a positive impact in the local community, supporting less privileged individuals and families

ST CANICE'S STUDENTS VISIT KATOOMBA FAC

Pupils from St Canice's, Katoomba, who make up their FIAT (Faith In Action Team) visited the Katoomba Blackheath Family Assistance Centre recently. The visit was in recognition of the school's ongoing commitment to assisting the local Conference in reaching out to people in need in the Upper Blue Mountains.

Each year the school contributes items for our Winter and Christmas Appeals. But it is their efforts during Term 3 of the school year which can only be described as outstanding for a small school of some 100 plus students. Under the leadership of Principal, Mrs Miriam Meaney, teacher Joanne Godsell and parent Carol Baker, a dedicated group organises the children and families to donate a different food item each week for the duration of the ten-week term.

During this Term Three initiative, running now for two years, hundreds of items each of milk, biscuits, breakfast cereal, tinned food, etc, have been donated to the Mary Killop Conference to assist in making up food parcels for clients. The visit to the FAC was organised to thank the pupils and so that they might see where Conference members meet with clients, and the fruits of their generous efforts ready to be made up into hampers for these clients.

The Vinnies Metro Schools Team is marking the start of a **Jubilee Year** filled with opportunities to live the gospel values of love, justice, and compassion. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the schools that supported the 2024 Vinnies Christmas Appeal.

Despite challenges posed by the cost of living, we were overwhelmed by the generosity shown, which brought much-needed support to individuals and families experiencing hardship during the festive season. We hope that our clients and conferences have also been blessed through the support of school communities.

In 2025, Vinnies invites schools to deepen their engagement in social justice activities and local conferences. The Metro Schools Team is happy to meet with local Conferences to discuss how schools can engage with Vinnies' mission throughout the year. Conferences are encouraged to prepare for the upcoming Winter Appeal and communicate any regional needs to Vinnies Support Centre coordinators.

Additionally, we seek the assistance of Conference members in answering the important question: "Why should a young person join Vinnies in their local area?" Conference members are invited to share their insights and experiences with students, helping them understand the profound impact they can have by contributing to their local communities through Vinnies.

We also encourage Conference members to be prepared to speak in schools during the Winter Appeal (School Sleepouts), sharing stories of local Vinnies works and inspiring students to get involved. By doing so, we hope to motivate young people to take action and join the mission of Vinnies.

The Vinnies Schools Team is excited to host the Mini Vinnies Gathering and Vinnies Secondary Schools Gathering in July at Australian Catholic University, Strathfield. These events offer students from primary and secondary schools the chance to explore Vinnies' work across Sydney, share ideas, and learn how they can contribute to the mission of the Society. Further details and registration information will be available soon, so be sure to keep an eye out for this exciting opportunity.

Additionally, Vinnies offers Social Justice Workshops for schools. These workshops cover important topics such as homelessness, poverty, human dignity, Catholic Social Teaching, migrants and refugees, and environmental stewardship. Schools can book these workshops for an engaging and informative experience that will inspire students to put their faith into action.

More and more people are at risk of losing a safe and secure place to call home. With housing stress on the rise, more people across NSW are facing mounting costs and the possibility of living from their car, couch surfing or living in tents for the first time.

Over 122,000 people are currently experiencing homelessness in Australia, including 35,000 people in NSW – the most of any state or territory. There's no one face of homelessness with people of all ages and backgrounds susceptible to going from stability to precarity in a short span of time. Homelessness could affect a neighbour, a colleague, a relative – it's never a choice, but sometimes it's the only option.

With increasing demand, homelessness services across NSW are struggling to meet need. That's why it is critical to prevent homelessness in the first place by providing early intervention supports and assistance. When people in NSW are referred to homelessness services before they lose their housing, they avoid homelessness 82.1% of the time.[1]

This year's Winter Appeal addresses homelessness, highlighting the factors that lead to homelessness and the support needed to recover and rebuild over the long-term. The Society works with people experiencing and at risk of homelessness every day, providing individual assistance with food, clothing, household bills, counselling, housing and early intervention support to prevent hardship from becoming chronic.

Funds raised through the Vinnies Winter Appeal will directly support our core programs, providing vital assistance to people experiencing or at risk of homelessness, poverty, and cost-of-living pressures.

The Society thanks our dedicated Members for the important role they play in raising funds for the Winter Appeal so we can continue to meet the rising need of the most vulnerable people in our community.

The Winter Appeal will launch on 1 May 2025.

We've introduced a new Work-Related Violence Policy to prevent and minimise the risk and impact of work-related aggression and violence when it does occur. The primary objective of the policy is to ensure the safety of our people, while acknowledging that our work with the people we assist must be trauma informed, and person centred. Federal Election 2025 – The call for Social Justice

Thanks to all of our wonderful members, volunteers, staff and friends who joined the Vinnies delegation at the Sydney Alliance pre-election Assembly on Thursday 13 March. Our over 40 strong team were among more than 800 people who gathered together at Westmead. The Assembly was an important show of solidarity, calling for change to policies on housing supply, energy affordability and climate justice in the lead up to the Federal budget and election campaign.

The week before, the Hunter Community Alliance also held an Assembly in Newcastle. Twelve Vincentians joined a 650 strong turnout at that event to listen to life stories, and ask politicians about, stretched services, lack of housing, homelessness and the energy transition that doesn't leave people behind.

At the Sydney Assembly, participants also shared life stories highlighting impacts of the failure of successive governments to provide safe, energy efficient and affordable housing, deal with homelessness, and provide affordable energy. Key asks were put to the Minister for Climate Change and Energy Chris Bowen and Dr Andrew Charlton MP, member for Parramatta by community leaders. As Tom Gersbach, Chair of Vinnies NSW Social Justice Committee put to the Assembly, "We know the impact of poverty and cost of living pressures on the people we assist. We want to see more investment in social, affordable and energy-efficient housing."

Subsequent to the Assembly, the Federal budget contains no new commitments on these issues. So, as Australia enters the Federal election campaign, it's time to reach out to Federal MPs and candidates to let them know who we are, what we do, and what our communities need to meaningfully address poverty and housing insecurity in our local areas.
