In this Newsletter, which is the first of our quarterly publications, there is highlighted a number of works undertaken by members with the assistance of our volunteers and outstanding staff under the leadership of Gayl Purchase, our Metropolitan Regional Director. Thanks to our members, volunteers and staff, this year not only began with a new structure that saw three Central Councils working together but also a wonderful working arrangement with our Client Support Officers (CSOs) during our COVID-19 isolation.

We began the year with Sydney Archdiocese Central Council (SACC), Parramatta Central Council (PCC) and Broken Bay

Central Council (BBCC) coming together to share Support Services. These Support Services come under our new Regional Director, Gayl Purchase. This is an example of our "One Society" to further enable our Vincentian Ideals to not only assist the people, we have the honour to serve in the Name of Jesus Christ but also to work together to achieve this with our members, volunteers and staff.

Our face to face meetings may have been greatly reduced but on line meetings and emails have been greatly beneficial in organising our activities to assist others.

Thanks to all our members, volunteers during this time. Let us pray for each other and for those whom we have the honour to serve in His Name.

We're well into our new financial year and while we are far from putting the COVID-19 pandemic behind us, I'm pleased to say our Vinnies Service Centres have remained open to continue to support those vulnerable in our community. This is in no doubt the result of the efforts of our wonderful staff, members and volunteers. While we have experienced a decrease of requests for support from the community we are gearing up for a greater demand after Job Keeper and Job Seeker payments cease. School communities have shown incredible generosity of donations during the Winter Appeal and our schools team are about to launch our Christmas appeal by preparing information packs for schools to ensure that our Conferences and Vinnies Service Centres have donated items and hampers. The Metro Schools team are making contact to

launch the 2020 Christmas appeal and are preparing information packs for schools to ask for donations towards Christmas hamper. Starting in September we will be providing a changed monthly report from all Vinnies Support Centres. These reports will detail how many people were assisted, how much money was spent in support of people in their local community and will have a case study highlighting the amazing work we

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Broken Bay Social Justice Network

The BBCC Social Justice Committee has been active for some time and we are fortunate to have representatives from all Regional Councils as well as members with diverse social justice backgrounds.

To introduce the committee members: Denis O'Rourke represents Wyong and Gosford Regional Councils, Bruce Whittet and Kevin Hardy represent Northern Beaches Regional Council, Εl Herlianto and Ferdinand Abenales represent Chatswood Regional Council and Colin McKenna represents Hornsby Regional Council. Other committee members include Bill and Carmel Aitken who are very active on a broad range of social justice matters and Anne Sheehan who is involved with a number of charitable organisations including Soroptimists, Anne is also Chair of the Hornsby Homelessness Taskforce. We are fortunate to have Ianice Stokes as a committee member. Janice is very knowledgeable on social justice matters and provides valuable advice and guidance to help us advocacy prioritise our work. Mark Ludbrooke from our Lewisham Social Justice Team has been a great supporter and helps us to structure

and polish our advocacy campaigns and correspondence.

Over the last couple of years the Committee has been focused on advocacy work aimed at increasing the supply of social and affordable housing. This has been demanding work as it involves liaising with state and local politicians as well as a broad range of like minded organisations. Progress to date is promising and we are actively engaged with a broad spectrum of our Broken Bay

of refugees and asylum seekers, a situation which has been exacerbated by the Covid Crisis. Bill Aitken is working with Social Justice Around the Bay and Jesuit Refugee Services in order to host a webinar on this topic. The webinar will be scheduled for the afternoon of Migrant and Refugee Sunday and more information on this event will be provided nearer the date. Mental health and wellbeing is a matter that we will be discussing at an upcoming meeting in order to consider whether we can make a

A number of our committee members are also involved with the Hornsby Shire Organising Committee which is chaired by the Sydney Alliance. The Committee is beginning to broaden its range of social justice activities to include addressing the desperate needs


Congratulations Barbara Healy for being a Finalist of Westfield Chatswood Local Hero

GOSFORD REGIONAL OFFICE RELOCATION

We have an exciting time ahead in the Gosford Region. Despite being closed to clients due to the Pandemic we are still operational. We take the requests for assistance by phone and email to our Conferences for our Members to complete visitation by phone and deliver assistance remotely and we are still assisting those in the Community who are without homes by providing material and food support at the door, of course using appropriate PPE and Social Distancing Practices.





The exciting New is that we are relocating. We are moving downstairs to 480 fabulous square metres of space recently vacated by the St Vincent de Paul LAC operations. The Region is enormously grateful to be allocated this space. It is a work in progress at present as our new Gosford Co-ordinator Lisa Dalton commences on the 12th of October and we should be all moved in for the 21st of October. We are all feeling very excited about this new Chapter in the Good Works of the Region.

The electrical and Communications work will be underway from the 28th of September. We are using the space as is, the fitout used by the LAC Operation as it suits our purposes precisely. we did ask for a Pantry/storage space which was built and is everything we asked for and more. We have three Conferences that operate out of the Gosford Regional Office and we now have the space to run groups and programs, offer hot desking arrangements to other services as well as those provided by the Society, making us a One Stop Shop Community Hub with training room, Small Group Space and Meeting Space available for those we walk with, Members and Services both internal and external. Please come back and see us when we are up and running.

Community sleep out 23rd October

Our local State MP for Gosford, Liesal Tesch will be joining our virtual sleepout to raise much needed funds for our homeless friends In our Region.

Liesal is a huge supporter of The Woy Woy and Gosford Community support Service.

At the end of the program all participants will receive a Certificate of Excellence and items to assist them in their tenancy.





Woy Woy Vinnies Support Centre Has secured a \$10,000 grant for our Ready2Rent program.

The Program #Ready2Rent will improve the opportunities of disadvantaged people who have previously struggled to secure and sustain a property to become successful tenants in the private rental market. The program will be open for all persons aged 25 years to 64 years old who are homeless or at risk of homelessness through various circumstances, filling a gap that has been identified by many services on the Central Coast. #Ready2Rent will support people who are considered "high risk" for potential landlords and real estate

agents. #Ready2Rent will provide valuable support and information from how to apply for a property right through to ending a tenancy favorably. It discusses various social housing applications, the eligibility criteria for those unable to enter the private rental market and provides information about relevant services. In addition, the program will cover topics such as living skills and wellness, realistic budgeting, open discussions about needs versus wants, communication and presentation skills.

Our Centre, Rosalie's Garden, is a friendly, safe space offering all who visit hope, trust and respect by giving guidance and reassurance in an environment where all feel welcomed and work towards achieving their goals. At the end of the program all participants will receive a Certificate of Excellence and items to assist them in their tenancy.


Vinnies Support Centre Co-ordinator - Chatswood and Northern Beaches

Wyong Vinnies Support Centre (47 Howarth Street, Wyong)

The centre is run by Vinnies Centre Coordinator (VCC) Brad Dingle and with the support of the Wyong Regional President Dennis Brady, fellow conference members plus the volunteers, they assist many community members that range from single parents, families and people who are homeless or have no fixed address.

During 2020, we have all been impacted by Covid-19. The main impact was the closing of our conference home visitation scheme, which saw all the community members within Wyong Region being referred to and assisted directly from the Wyong Office. The Wyong office is open Monday - Friday from 9am - 3pm. The services we provide include food hampers, food vouchers, clothing/manchester/household vouchers, furniture vouchers, chemist vouchers men's & women's toiletries packs, homeless food packs, petrol vouchers, frozen food parcels, counselling, AOD Support, NILS & referrals/support. We have seen an increase in new clients coming into the office for assistance, which has been due to the global impact Covid 19 has had on the world, including people losing jobs, unable to afford rent & and a high increase in mental health.

Many of the people we assist like coming into the Wyong office because it is a very supportive, non judgmental and safe place for many of the community members we assist and support.

WINTER APPEAL ORGANISED BY THE YOUTH TEAM



VINNIES PREPARES TO LAUNCH COMMUNITY CONNECT

Community Connect is a one to one friendship program that matches volunteers with members of the community who are experiencing social isolation due to mental health concerns other and personal challenges. Community Connect is the new name being given to the Compeer Program which has been operating very successfully in NSW since 1995. The opportunity for friendship will now be on offer to people who are isolated and not just those with a mental health diagnosis.

Mental health challenges often cause people to become socially isolated. This puts people at risk of experiencing issues. health It's a vicious cycle. Community Connect is aimed at building optimism, confidence and quality of life for individuals thereby enabling them to participate more fully in community life. It does so through the power of friendship. Over the years the friendship program has delivered so many good news stories across all age ranges and cultural backgrounds in greater Sydney and the central coast.

There's the story of Suzanne in her late sixties, who had suffered anxiety and depression ever since losing her mother at an early age. Suzanne went on to marry and have children but when her husband passed away a few years ago, her mental health went downhill. She

had limited contact with her children and she felt desperately lonely. Suzanne's counsellor talked to her about the friendship program and she agreed to join. She was introduced to Fiona, a lady of a similar age They hit it off immediately. Together, Suzanne and Fiona joined an art group and have met new people. Suzanne regained her confidence. As a result, she has become close friends with a neighbor. She is feeling very different now about her life and her future.



There's the story of Ken, who was introduced to Brett in the friendship program. Ken had suffered a traumatic workplace injury a few years before, which kept him isolated at home. His confidence and social skill ebbed away. His only joy was following his favourite NRL team. Each year when the season ended he went into a deep fog. Ken and Brett were introduced towards the end of an NRL season. Brett had followed rugby league when he was younger and Ken's passion rebuilt his interest. Ken gained enough confidence to actually join the Leagues Club, where he has met some fellow supporters who are just as passionate as he is. Ken is so much happier now that he is engaging in his local community.

At the younger end of the spectrum there is Geoff and Michael, both in their early twenties. Geoff was attacked and robbed in the street a few years ago. He experienced very high anxiety and isolated himself from virtually most of the people he knew. He was suspicious of everyone and became more insecure and less confident and confined himself to a room at his parents' house. His parents were very supportive and slowly got him up and out again. He agreed to join the friendship program where he met Michael. They shared the same interest fantasy movies and photography and did a course together. Geoff is now feeling that he's almost ready to resume studying and looking for a part time job.

Vanessa is in her mid-twenties and was born in Vietnam. She arrived here as child and had a very different home life to most of the children she went to school with. As well as speaking only Vietnamese at home she always felt lost when everyone at school was talking about the latest music, movies or television shows. Vanessa's sister was a high academic achiever and has a wellpaid and successful career. Vanessa is less financially driven and more creative. She became more withdrawn and anxious. Her psychologist referred her to the friendship program and met Sophia. Sophia came from a big family with an Italian cultural heritage. Sophia is bubbly, positive and always smiling. Sophia coaxed her to join their dancing group. Vanessa loved it! Since the COVID 19 restrictions the two catch up regularly on social media.

10/10 World Mental Health Day. Vinnies NSW works closely with those experiencing mental ill-health and has seen first-hand how homelessness, unemployment, and social isolation can impact mental health and well-being.

In October last year, Vinnies NSW launched the "Mental Health and Well-being Social Justice Statement" at the annual Rosalie Rendu Forum. This was a symbolic commitment to do more as a Society in response to the challenges people face when experiencing mental ill-health.

In August this year, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference released their Social Justice statement, "To Live Life to the Full: Mental health in Australia today". The Bishops' Statement aligns well with the Vinnies NSW Mental Health and Well-being Social Justice Statement, and is a timely reminder for us to better support one another and break down the stigma associated with mental ill-health.

On Wednesday 16/09, Vinnies hosted a Webinar to learn more about the Bishops' Statement on Mental Health, ongoing challenges people face in accessing the care and support they need, and to discuss ways in which the St Vincent de Paul Society NSW can take action.

Vinnies Build Homes, Build Hope is campaigning for the NSW Government to invest in 5,000 new social housing homes every year for the next 10 years. We are doing this because there are more than 100,000 people waiting for social housing across NSW right now – some of whom will wait up to ten years. At the same time, 37,000 people are homeless. We launched our campaign in September last year. Since that time, in spite of drought, floods, bushfires and a pandemic, Members of the Society have had more than 100 engagements with their MPs and collected more than 7,140 signatures on our hardcopy petition. We need to collect another 2,860 signatures on our hard copy petition so we reach 10,000 signatures and are eligible to have our petition tabled and debated in NSW Parliament.
