'A Call to Action' was a joint initiative organized by Hunter Community Alliance, Hunter Homeless Connect and Nova for Women and Children held on 29th March at Civic Park Newcastle. A tent city was erected on the foreshore to bring urgent attention to accommodation and housing crisis that is not only affecting the Hunter, but right across the state. Our dedicated staff at Mathew Talbot were in attendance and Team Leader, Ryan Pryor addressed the crowd, highlighting the strain on the sector and sharing alarming statistics including the 82 referrals waiting for a caseworker within the service. St Vincent de Paul continue to have a voice through the Build Homes Build Hope Campaign and we hold hope that the June Budget sees the government investing more in Social and Affordable housing.





BEING VINCENTIAN

Over the past couple of months, we have celebrated the commissioning of nine Conference and Council Presidents, plus the awarding of two Life Memberships to two long standing members of the Society in the Lismore Central Council. It's not that we have had a great turnover of presidents recently, rather we have just had a 'Covid catch up.' A member recommitment was also incorporated in two of these liturgies.

The Rule tells us that Conferences and Councils are genuine communities of faith and love, of prayer and action. It states that, "the entire Society is a true and unique worldwide community of Vincentian friends." This is the third dimension of the Society, the dimension of mutual support, inspiration and friendship.

Janelle was then given a tour of the Lismore Centre before coming upstairs to the Lismore office where Janelle met with Clare Van Doorn (*North East RD*), Gail Gaudron (*Lismore CC President*), Mick Albany (*Richmond Regional President*), Gene Trim (*Richmond Social Justice Rep.*), Anne Kenny (Richmond Regional Secretary) and Rosie to discuss housing affordability, housing supply and homelessness in our region.

The meeting concluded with a plan to have a meeting with other agencies and stakeholders who are also campaigning and seeking improvement in the housing crisis.
